Learning During a Pandemic

2020 has become one of those years that everyone will talk about in the future. Where were you in COVID-19? For our current enrollment of SMIS learners, I hope that they will answer "St. Michael's International School" with a large amount of pride.

But it was St. Michael's International School with a difference, as our curious, conscientious and enthusiastic young learners spent ten weeks learning from home via our newly created Distance Learning Programme, supported by their teachers and teaching assistants, not to mention their parents who were thrown into the role of support teacher with very little notice. Such is the speed of a pandemic!

It is important to note that although there are obvious differences between the delivery of face-to-face learning compared to a distance learning programme, the curriculum content remains equivalent. Distance learning activities were carefully planned to build on children's knowledge and to further develop a range of age-appropriate skills which all offer increased benefits for the child in terms of deepening their learning. The activities were also designed to target personal skills, offering opportunities for children to apply their communication, collaboration,



creativity and critical thinking skills. Importantly, with children working from home - often in isolation - we wanted to maintain a sense of community through a range of whole school projects designed to bring everyone together with a common purpose; to create a sense of us all being connected. These included activities such as a recycling project, the Koinobori project during Golden Week, a happiness project as well as a Virtual Easter Bonnet Parade. All this, in addition to the regular daily, classroom activities you would expect of a fully accredited international school.

It has been a stressful, unpredictable time for everyone, the pandemic has impacted us all and certainly we feel sympathy for the disruption caused to every one of our families at this time. But our ability to transfer learning to a virtual platform has been a tremendous bonus and I am proud of the developing skills of our talented and industrious staff who have experienced a tremendous learning curve as they worked hard to support our young learners and their families. Out of this period of uncertainty has come a robust Distance Learning Policy that can be implemented if and when circumstances cause St. Michael's International School to close its campus in the future. Be that for just one or two days due to a passing typhoon, or a much longer period due to a more dangerous disaster or pandemic.
