

Alina Grishko, who is our new ELL Teacher, was already in Japan, therefore, was able to make a smooth transition to

Kobe. We welcome both the new teachers into our SMIS Family.

I am delighted to have joined St. Michael's International School as the Year 3 teacher. Despite an interesting few months leading up to my arrival in Kobe, the transition has been very smooth and I have thoroughly enjoyed my first three months living in Japan.

My teaching career all began six years ago when I left university and travelled to Tanzania in East Africa to take up a voluntary teaching position in a primary school. I loved experiencing a new culture, meeting new people and, quite importantly, the teaching. Upon arriving back in the UK, I took on a learning support role working with children with special educational needs in Early Years and Year 1. During this time, I successfully enrolled on a postgraduate teaching course.

After qualifying as a primary teacher, I worked for three years in South London as a Year 3 teacher but I was always aware of my desire to live and work internationally again. I was drawn to St. Michael's because I quickly saw the importance of their school and wider community and I have already experienced this in abundance. Everyone has been very welcoming and supportive as I have settled in in Kobe. I am

this August. I am thrilled to be part of such a warm and welcoming international community in Kobe. I was born and raised in Spokane, Washington, USA; however, my parents are originally from Ukraine. I grew up speaking English, Ukrainian, and Russian, which inspired me to study language acquisition at University.

I graduated from Northwest University with a Bachelor of Arts in Elementary Education and English Language Learning (ELL). During my time at Northwest University, I had the privilege of teaching in a first-grade classroom for one year. Then, I taught English in Costa Rica for a month to complete my ELL certification. My experiences taught me how to scaffold for beginner English students effectively.

In July of 2019, I moved to a beautiful rice farming town called Taka-Cho in Hyogo to teach as an Assistant Language Teacher at two prefectural high schools. This position has helped me develop a better understanding of the challenges English learners encounter in Japan. Also, I learned the impact that culture has on education. My goal as an educator is to help ELL students master English so that they will feel empowered to pursue their dreams. 


Why not Share your Happiness and Support St. Michael's!
