Reflecting on my experience working at UNESCO's Asia Pacific Bureau of Education in Bangkok, Thailand

After graduating from Columbia University with a master's degree in international affairs, I started working at UNESCO in Bangkok, Thailand. I was part of the Inclusive Quality Education Department, and my research responsibilities were on early childhood education and multilingual education in the Asia-Pacific. One of the highlights during my time there was publishing an article in the local newspaper on a multilingual education program in Thailand.
